Ezekiel 33:7–20 1 Corinthians 10:1–13 Luke 13:1–9

Jesus Calls You to Repentance

"Unless you repent, you will all likewise perish" (Luke 13:3, 5). By this warning, the Lord would turn us away from wickedness and bring us to life in Himself.
